ANGELA'S STORY

Every addict or alcoholic believes the last time was the last time, but that is not always the case. This time, however, the one thing I am doing differently is that I give God all the glory. I now ask Him to help me get through each challenge I encounter, rather than turning back to what I know doesn't work.

I had been clean approximately three months when I arrived at Guiding Light Ministries on Friday, August 5, 2016. I hit the ground running on Monday and filled out necessary paperwork at Job and Family Services, and stopped at a few businesses nearby and picked up job applications. On Tuesday I dropped off my first application, and I started on Thursday, August 11th.

Unlike previous times I had obtained clean time, this time instead of immediately looking for housing I attempted a different path. I began attending AA meetings on a weekly basis, and started saving money from my new job. I formulated a plan that would allow me to obtain Christmas items for my two children, as I worked the program of attending devotions and classes provided on a weekly basis. After church on Sundays, my father would pick me up, take me to pick up my children, and then take me to his house for visitation. He would then take my children home, and bring me back home. As I felt more confident, I began to accomplish many things. My employer told me the position of Kitchen Manager would be available in June and he would like me to take it. I attended and completed a Trauma Class @ Coleman Professionals, Parenting Class, received a Recovery Coach and medication there and an 8-hour Driver's Safety class. I then paid off fines and reinstatement fees, obtained a car, and my permit. I had kept these little accomplishments to myself, and so after getting my Driver's License back after seven years, I videoed the reaction of my children when I picked them up myself. I know I will replay it over and over, hearing my daughter say, "I'm so proud of you."

I now have almost 10 months of clean time. I continue to attend AA, see my Recovery Coach, and have visitation with my children every week. I also maintain my attendance at classes, church and keep up with my daily chore. I keep all scheduled doctor's appointments and take medications as prescribed. My next step is to obtain housing, and today I will go commit to a fully furnished home. I see God at work in every aspect of my life and I recognize I could not have done any of this on my own, but only with His help. Everything I have been through in the past was for a reason, and the reason is summed up best by my favorite verse in the Bible - Romans 8:28 which states, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose." (KJV).
